

Exporting Images to Your BlackBerry®

REQUIREMENTS: ShowCase 5.1 or later running on a Windows computer; Apple QuickTime® 7 or later (available as a free download from www.apple.com/quicktime/download)



First You will Need to Configure Your Export to BlackBerry Settings

1. Select any image and press the Export button or choose the Export Image As... menu item from the File menu. This will bring up the Export Images dialog.



Select the **Phone Setup** button shown above. If you are always exporting to your own phone or always emailing your exported files, you might only do this setup once.

2. In the **BlackBerry Settings** section of the configuration dialog, browse to the folders where the exported images should be stored. You might use folders you are already using to sync photos to your BlackBerry. (See the BlackBerry manual for your model to see how to add photos to your BlackBerry.)

Adjust the **Number of seconds to loop short clips** setting.

This setting allows you to specify the minimum time that a short clip will be shown on your BlackBerry. The default setting is 12 seconds which means a one second clip will loop 12 times.

Press the **Save Settings** button to complete the set up.

Now You Can Export Images with the BlackBerry Button

3. Click to select the images you would like to add to your BlackBerry. (Shift-Click selects a range of images and Ctrl-Click adds an individual image to the selection.) Then click on the Export button or choose the Export Image As... menu item from the ShowCase File menu. This will bring up the Export Images dialog.
4. Now just click the BlackBerry button at the top. The statics and clips will be written to the folders you have specified in a format compatible with the BlackBerry displays.



If your images were exported to a BlackBerry sync folder (Photos, Videos) they will automatically import to your phone the next time you sync.

Move or Email the Images if You Need to

If you are moving the images to a different computer or have your export folders set to locations that are not part of the BlackBerry sync files then you will need to use a Windows Explorer window (My Computer) to find and move your exported files. Or you might want to email the images to yourself or others. From your BlackBerry email you can save the images to your phone using the "Save Attachment" BlackBerry functions.
